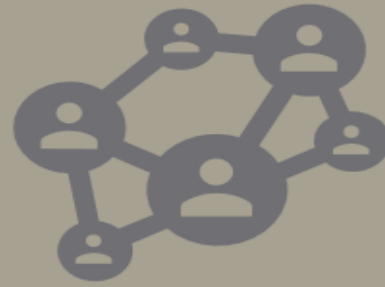


# Medical Volunteerism as a Tool for Open Education and Social Inclusion
